

Diagonal Double Pocket Card—Slim Version

This design of this card is a variation of a traditional Diagonal Double Pocket Card. A graphic tutorial on how to make the traditional card is at www.robinscraftroom.com/techniques/diagonal-double-pocket-card/. These instructions are for the basic slim card itself, and do not include instructions for decorations and embellishments, or for the bookmarks that I inserted into the pockets. Instructions for mounting the Pocket Card on Card Stock are at the end of the basic instructions.

MATERIALS

1 sheet Stampin' Up! Designer Paper, 12" high x 6" wide.

INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1: Fold the paper in half vertically and horizontally as shown.

NOTE: The "inside" of the folded paper will be the side that shows the most on the front of the finished card.

Plan accordingly!



Step 2: Trim 1" from the bottom of the paper and cut on the middle folded line in from the left edge to the center vertical fold. (Note that the reason for trimming the 1" from the bottom AFTER the folds is that it's much easier to fold a piece of paper in half than at an odd measurement.)



Step 3: Fold the upper left corner of the paper down to the right meeting the center vertical line with the edge of the paper. Apply adhesive to the left edge of the upper left quadrant.



Step 4: Fold the upper left quadrant to the right pressing the adhesive.



Step 5: Fold the lower right corner up to the left, meeting the center line with the edge of the paper.

Step 6:

Fold the lower left quadrant BEHIND the newly folded lower right quadrant. Fold the new lower right corner up to meet the left folded edge of the card. Apply adhesive as shown by the pink strips.

Step 7: Fold the bottom half of the card up to the top, pressing adhesive.



TO MOUNT ON CARD STOCK

MATERIALS:

Coordinating Card Stock:

2 pieces: 6-1/4" x 3" & 6-3/4" x 3"

INSTRUCTIONS

Adhere the Diagonal Double Pocket Card to the smaller piece of card stock with 1/8" showing at both top & bottom. Punch the top and bottom of the larger piece of card stock with a scallop type border punch. Mount the rest of the card on this piece. It will fit in a Stampin' Up! Small Open End Envelope for mailing.
