




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This quilt square was made using sheets from Stampin' Up!'s Designer Series Paper set, **Blueberry Crisp**, with the green from the DSP set, **Greenhouse Gala**. You can use any papers, though, with the pieces cut according to the guide below.

The finished quilt block is 4-1/2" square. Cut a piece of **grid paper** 4-1/2" square and apply strips of adhesive horizontally. Begin at the bottom row and work up. Unless you're a cutting expert, some squares will end up being slightly too large or too small. Many of mine were, yet the card still is very lovely (IMHO!). Trim as you go if you wish. After all the pieces are laid down, trace the cut lines using Stampin' Up!'s **Basic Black Journaler**. I layered this card on **Basic Black**, **Pear Pizzazz**, & **Pacific Point** card stock, all on a 5-1/4" square card of **Sahara Sand**.
