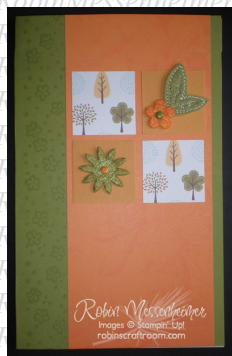


## Covered Note Pad

A fun and quick gift for anyone on your gift list!



Fit the note pad cover around the note pad to ensure that you're using the side with the best fit as the front of the note pad cover.

Using the Stampin' Up! Wheel, wheel an image along the left side of the front of the note pad cover. Here I used a Stampin' Around Wheel Guide to aid in making a straight line.



### Supplies Needed

- 2 pieces of Solid Card Stock: 8" x 10-1/4" and 5" x 2" (this is the note pad cover)
- Coordinating Designer Series Paper 8" x 3-1/2"
- 2 pieces of Coordinating Card stock 1-1/2" square
- 2 pieces of Coordinating Designer Series Paper 1-1/2" square
- Embellishments (Sweet Pea Stitched Felt and Flower Fusion Felt pieces, with various colored brads used here.)
- Stampin' Up! Standard or Jumbo Stampin' Around Wheel and coordinating ink cartridge.
- 5" x 8" note pad.

Using the Stampin' Up! Anywhere Glue Stick, apply glue to the inside back cover. Adhere cover to the note pad, adjusting the fit as needed. Glue Stick will stay flexible long enough for you to do this better than other adhesives will.

### Instructions

- Score the note pad cover 5" in from each short edge.

- Score the 2" x 5" piece of card stock at 3/4" and 1" in from each long edge.

- Fold the 2" x 5" piece of card stock over the top of the note pad as shown. Trim as needed and adhere.



You are going to be covering the printed top of the note pad with the 5" x 2" piece of card stock.



Glue the front of the folded card stock so that the edge is aligned with the edge of the printed top.



Turn the pad over and adhere the other side of the card stock to the back of the pad.

Embellish the front of the cover. For these two note pad covers, I used paper from the 2010 Occasions Mini Catalog set, Sweet Pea. I arranged the 4 square pieces and then attached felt pieces to two or three of the squares using Tombow Multipurpose Adhesive. I applied the adhesive to the square then set the flowers, some with brads inserted, onto the glue. I let it set for 10 to 15 minutes before moving the pad.
